Shadowing	<ul> <li>Shadowing consists of following around a medical professional during their job. You might get to:         <ul> <li>Observe the medical practitioner's day-to-day</li> <li>Watch procedures and examinations</li> <li>Interact with patients</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Understand different specialties and medical environments</li> <li>Gain hands-on experiences</li> <li>Opportunities to observe the patient-physician relationship</li> <li>Can help you decide if healthcare is the right path</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Do you personally know any doctors? Ask them if they have any opportunities for shadowing</li> <li>When you go to the doctor, tell them about your healthcare interest and ask if they offer any shadowing opportunities</li> <li>Reach out to medical professionals via phone or email</li> </ul>
Research	<ul> <li>Wet Lab         <ul> <li>Wet labs are for manipulating liquids, biological matter, and chemicals.</li> <li>Have more intense design requirements with live cell cultures and or chemicals</li> </ul> </li> <li>Dry Lab         <ul> <li>Dry labs focus on physics, engineering, and computation.</li> <li>Involve analysis, modeling, and simulations</li> </ul> </li> <li>Research also exists for the humanities!         <ul> <li>Might involve reading literary work, conducting interviews</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Dive into a curiosity</li> <li>Explore research as a career option</li> <li>Opportunity to build a relationship with a professor who can serve as a mentor</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Email professors that interest you!</li> <li>Introduce yourself and your background</li> <li>Talk about why you are interested in their research</li> <li>Ask to set up a meeting to learn more about their research</li> <li>During the meeting, ask whether their lab has any opportunity for you to join and research with them</li> </ul>
Healthcare- Related Programs	<ul> <li>Often lasts a few weeks, takes place at a university</li> <li>May offer opportunities including         <ul> <li>Hands-on labs (i.e. suturing kits, CPR training, starting an IV)</li> <li>Panels or seminars of healthcare professionals</li> <li>Tours of an ambulance or hospitals</li> <li>Mentorship opportunities</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Provide in-depth exposure into various healthcare fields</li> <li>Gain hands-on experiences</li> <li>Can help you decide if healthcare is the right path</li> <li>Meet peers with similar interests</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Google your interests and search through different universities' websites</li> <li>Be prepared to apply! You might need to write some essays and submit a resume</li> </ul>
