Provide examples of both healthcare-related and non-healthcare-related volunteer opportunities (they're both important!)             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Healthcare-related:                 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Volunteer at a hospital or clinic</li> <li>ii. Serve as a medical scribe</li> <li>iii. Volunteer at a healthcare-related nonprofit organization</li> <li>iv. Volunteer at an elderly care home or in hospice care</li> </ol> </li> <li>b. Shadowing	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Explain what shadowing is and what it might look like:             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Observe the medical practitioner's day-to-day</li> <li>b. Watch procedures and examinations</li> <li>c. Interact with patients</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Discuss the benefits             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Understand different specialties and medical environments</li> <li>b. Gain hands-on experiences</li> <li>c. Opportunities to observe the patient-physician relationship</li> <li>d. Can help you decide if healthcare is the right path</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
Research	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Give a definition of research: Research is a careful and detailed study on a topic in order to establish and support hypotheses or new knowledge and</li> </ol>



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	<p>develop new understandings of existing knowledge</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Explain what various research work could look like             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Wet Lab                 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Wet labs are for manipulating liquids, biological matter, and chemicals.</li> <li>ii. Have more intense design requirements with live cell cultures and or chemicals</li> </ol> </li> <li>b. Dry Lab                 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Dry labs focus on physics, engineering, and computation.</li> <li>ii. Involve analysis, modeling, and simulations</li> </ol> </li> <li>c. Research also exists for the humanities!                 <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>i. Might involve reading literary work, conducting interviews</li> </ol> </li> </ol> </li> <li>3. Benefits             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Dive into a curiosity</li> <li>b. Explore research as a career option</li> <li>c. Opportunity to build a relationship with a professor who can serve as a mentor</li> </ol> </li> </ol>
<p>Healthcare-Related Programs</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Give a description             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Often lasts a few weeks, takes place at a university</li> <li>b. May offer opportunities including</li> <li>c. Hands-on labs (i.e. suturing kits, CPR training, starting an IV)</li> <li>d. Panels or seminars of healthcare professionals</li> <li>e. Tours of an ambulance or hospitals</li> <li>f. Mentorship opportunities</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Review benefits             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Provide in-depth exposure into various healthcare fields</li> <li>b. Gain hands-on experiences</li> <li>c. Can help you decide if healthcare is the right path</li> <li>d. Meet peers with similar interests</li> </ol> </li> <li>3. Scholarship Information             <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Sometimes camps offer scholarships OR you can find scholarships online (like in</li> </ol> </li> </ol>

Focus questions and answers on topics previously covered</li> </ol> </li> <li>2. Optional: Create breakout rooms for students to ask questions in small-group settings</li> </ol>
